July 14th Commissioner's Meeting Notes

- We continue to wait for the DNR to release our lake study report.
- Noted receipt of permission by the owners of "Outlot A" on Trout Rd. for District to use for weed harvesting.
- Noted beaver activity at the dam seems to lessening. Cleanup by volunteers seems to be working to keep dam open. Possibly there is another dam further downstream as water is building up below dam.
- Voted to cancel picnic in lieu of proposal at annual

- meeting to have picnic at nearby park immediately following meeting in future.
- Noted placement of new DNR signs at boat dock by Beverly Fagan.
- Decided to continue with weed cutting contract this year and shorten time if needed to keep weeds from settling to bottom.
- Crafted 2009-2010 budget proposal items for annual meeting.
- Discussed winter aerator marking law. Determined that our method is approved in WI law.
- Voted to comply with Oneida County Land Information Office to correct District boundaries so they conform to legal land descriptions of individual properties.
- Voted to reinstate one property erroneously exempted from District many years ago.
