April 11th Meeting Notes

- Noted Joe Helmuth's resignation as Secretary sometime before annual meeting. [currently, we have no one to send out newsletters]
- Noted Mike & Kim Esler's continued volunteer efforts to test our lake water and send samples to DNR for lab work.
- Noted approval for our application for 2nd lake grant to check for Eurasian Water Milfoil and Curly-Leaf

- Pondweed, both invasive species, in 2013.
- Discussed setting money aside over two years to cover estimated costs after DNR reimbursement.
- Discussed cost estimate for replacing portions of aerator when it becomes necessary.
- Discussed completed 2013 weed harvesting contract with Schmidt Landscaping.
- Discussed only posting newsletters on our website instead of separate mailings twice a year. [Agreed to bring this up at annual meeting.]

Second Lake Study Grant

In order to find out whether or not we have Eurasian Water Milfoil, beyond the Kildeer dock area, and the current locations of Curly-leaf Pondweed, another invasive plant species present in our lake for some time, we applied and were recently given a second lake study grant. While the District would need to pay money out and wait for reimbursement, state money would come back quarterly before the project is

completed in 2014. The testing would be done in two stages: early spring 2013 for Curly-leaf, and August, 2013 for Eurasian Water Milfoil. Final reimbursement will come in 2014 after the paperwork has been completed and approved. We have already received an advance payment from the state for \$870.

Total cost of the lake study will be \$3,487. The state will cover 75% so our cost will be \$1,162.

We are eager to find out whether our lake has EWM dispersed throughout. The information we learn will determine our future course of action. If we find EWM dispersed throughout the lake, we will need to deal with it as soon as we can to prevent it from compromising our entire lake environment. We plan to set money aside over two years to cover the cost.

Lake Water Testing

Mike and Kim Esler have volunteered to continue our lake testing for official DNR reporting in 2013. They attended a DNR seminar to stay upto-date on new procedures and replenish supplies.

Aerator Maintenance

So far, our aerator has been operating effectively, with proper yearly maintenance, but obsolete parts are becoming difficult to find. Since the piping is still in good shape, we would need approximately \$5,500 to replace the mechanical parts with new, more modern equipment. We plan to set money aside in our next three budgets. We investigated getting a loan from the Public Lands Commission in Lake Tomahawk but were told our project is much too small for them to deal with

Weed Cutting

Maximum acreage allowed by our permit is 60 acres. We have one more year on our permit before re-applying in 2014. Schmidt's Landscaping will be harvesting our weeds during the third week in July this year. One-hundred hours has been budgeted for 2013.

Check Your Boats and Trailers

Be sure your boat has NO plant material when you launch your boat in Horsehead Lake or take it out. Your boat and trailer should be washed thoroughly with soap and water before re-launching in our lake if it has been in another body of water. Leaving it out of the water for a full week will substitute for washing with soap.

Did you know?

- 1) Wisconsin now has a wolfhunting season and the latest hunt did not significantly reduce their numbers.
- 2) Horsehead Lake will be getting another 9,000 Large Mouth bass planted in our lake this year for a grand total of 27,000.
- 3) Wisconsin law requires every boat to carry a life-preserver cushion kept in a ready-to-throw location in case of emergency.
- 4) If you drop your cell phone in the lake, you can dry it out by placing it in a plastic bag of rice for at least 24 hrs. It worked for us ©
