

Although lake levels on numerous lakes have dropped dramatically, due to the absence of rain, ours has remained close to the normal because we have ample springs to replenish water loss.

For the first time in many years, August anglers have been able to fish without snagging weeds with nearly every cast of the line.

Credit needs to be given to residents for no reportable accidents on the lake. With the number of people who use our lake, that's somewhat remarkable. Keep up the good work!

There will be approx. four meetings, beginning this fall, with several important tasks for the leaders to accomplish:

- develop and tally a survey
- coordinate with residents
- evaluate final results of the study
- discuss possible recommendations for Lake Policies.



Weed Cutting

Cliff Schmidt of Schmidt's Landscaping, Iola, WI, did weed cutting this year beginning July 14th. Cliff has been contracted for 80 hours in 2008 for about the same time in July.

For whatever reason, we had fewer weeds this year, and Cliff used only 40 hours and collected 11 harvester loads. In 2006, he collected 55 loads. At that time, the weeds were mostly Elodea and Coontail. This year, the weeds were mostly Narrow Leaf Pond Weed. So far, there's been no evidence of Eurasian Water Milfoil, which plagues many of our northern lakes. We need to be especially vigilant of the boat landing for signs of the Eurasian Milfoil, as that's where most of our offlake boats enter the lake.
