# April 6<sup>th</sup> Commissioner's Meeting Notes

- Our lake study has been submitted to DNR for approval, including a revised weed cut map.
- Stuart Utley represented our District at the WAL convention in Green Bay in March.
- Congratulated Tom Rudolph on his recent award from Oneida County Land & Water Conservation Committee for his dedicated conservation efforts.
- Volunteers on opening day May 2nd will monitor our Kildeer boat dock for Eurasion Water Milfoil.
- Motion passed to inquire about marking EWM with signs near dock.
- Motion passed to hire an expert to check for EWM near dock and remove it for a max. of \$300.

- Discussed re-grading boat dock to eliminate gravel buildup caused by "power loading"
- Discussed placement of new signs at boat dock regarding EWM
- Motion passed to send registered letter to owners of Trout Rd. "outlot A" requesting permission to use for removing cut weeds.
- Changed mileage reimbursement to current federal tables. Currently the amount is \$.55 per mile for official business by commissioners.
- Motion to send letter to Oneida Co. Labor Relations Committee to fill the AIS coordinator position ASAP.

#### What are PBT's?



PBT's are toxic trace chemicals that are present in the environment. They accumulate gradually in fish, wildlife, and humans. PBT stands for "Persistent Bioaccumulative Toxins and they have severe negative health effects on:

- 1) nervous system
- 2) reproductive system
- 3) Developmental probs.
- 4) Immune-response suppression,
- 5) Cell growth (cancer).
- 6) Endocrine system

Lead, mercury, dioxin, and PCB's are common PBT's and can be controlled by the wise use of burn barrels. These materials. once they enter the environment, last a very long time, and usually do not decompose, posing an increasing threat to health. Please do not burn plastic grocery bags, painted or treated wood, aluminum foil, Styrofoam, or plastic of any kind. Help keep our environment clean and healthy. Bottom-line - BURN ONLY PAPER.

Don't forget to pick up a new burn permit for 2009

I know that many of you are anxious to see the final lake study report. These things seem to move at glacial speed and it can be frustrating. The report is finished and has been submitted to the DNR in Rhinelander for approval. Unfortunately, the agency has been downsized, which creates a work overload. Watch for the announcement on our web page and plan to attend.

### Did you know?

- Black bears can run 30 MPH.
- Gypsy Moth eggs can be killed by using Golden Pest Spray or soaking eggs in soapy water - late April to late May.

- Homeowners are liable for fire damage from sparks that stray to others' property.
- A person loses 25
  times more heat from
  cold water as from cold
  air. (hypothermia)
- 5) A bear will eat 11-18 lbs. of food a day. The largest WI bear was 600 lbs. The average is 250-350 lbs.
- 6) The most important boat safety tip is to always wear a life jacket.

### Legislative News

Gov. Jim Doyle signed a law which prohibits the use of phosphorus in lawn fertilizers beginning May 1, 2010.

Waiting for the governor's signature is a bill that will create a "No Wake" zone within 100 feet of shoreline in all WI lakes.
